During the session, the homeless providers are given materials to post in their offices and hand out to families explaining the eligibility for education services and student's rights. Also, throughout the year, DHL and staff visit shelters and provide ongoing technical assistance with homeless providers. The CoC adopted Standards of Care that require providers serving households with children to ensure services for minors are established. including childcare, school enrollment and/or transportation to school of origin, early childhood programs, afterschool programs, health care, special need assistance and services, and school-based services. Adult household members may also have access to parenting education, health care, and family services on a voluntary basis.

On October 5, 2021, CoC providers completed online training on Evidenced Based Practices in the context of Victim-Centered Approach w/National Criminal Justice Training Center. The CoC shares national training opportunities with providers and per ČoC policy, we provide at least one training quarterly with DV training provided at least once annually. 2. On June 24, 2021, with the help of CSH, we provided a CES training that covered DV assessment and referral. The CoC shares national training opportunities with CES providers and per CoC policy, we provide at least one training quarterly with DV training provided at least once annually. Previous training has been completed by the State Attorney's office, CAHSD (county run, largest social service provider), Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Lotus House and the International Institute for Restorative Practices on safety planning, screening for violence, restorative justice, confidentiality rules, Trauma Informed Care, Seeking Safety, victim-centered Empowerment Model & how to access the Coordinated Victims Assistance Center (the only one-stop family justice center in FL w/40 on-site partners) and other resources provided for victims of DV.

The report looked at LOS, cost per client, utilization of services, unmet requests for services, median rents & calls to the DV helpline among other data. Recommendations included adding flexibility to local tax dedicated to DV survivors, creation of DV Risk Mitigation/Landlord Assistance Fund, using ESG for DV RRH, maintaining a level of support for clustered style TH, conducting a separate evaluation to assess the specific impacts and effectiveness of DV programs on children, revision of client survey instruments, continuing review of performance data, and continued DV/CoC intersect.

 CoC CES providers have been trained to assess for violence & refer clients to the Coordinated Victim's Assistance Center (the only one-stop family justice center in FL w/40 on-site partners). The CES includes state certified DV providers who receive CoC funding for ES, TH & RRH & refer to EHV. Specialized SO teams use licensed clinicians trained in trauma informed care and other best practices. Miami-Dade implemented a 24/7 DV texting landline so victims can text an advocate when calling can place them in danger. 2. CoC programs providing ES, TH, PH must allow DV/dating violence/sexual assault/stalking victims to request emergency transfer. The CoC prioritizes these transfers. HUD forms 5380/5382/5383 are provided & explained to survivors at intake & posted on our website. Landlord Participation Agreements incorporate VAWA & confidentiality rules. The CoC, w/HUD & local TA, worked closely w/administrators of all 4 PHAs (Miami-Dade, Hialeah, Homestead, Miami Beach) to amend their administrative plans in order to adopt homeless admission preferences. TA provided guidance on how to amend plans, drafted language to incorporate & provided guidance on how to communicate the preferences to persons on PHA waiting lists. This has allowed us to leverage HCV, PBV, Mainstream, EHV, FUP, FYI and Public Housing. The CoC also partnered w/City of Miami and Carrfour which both received an allocation of Mainstream Vouchers w/which the CoC makes referrals. Our CoC Housing Coordinator makes coordinated referrals to all homeless preferences and set-asides, inc. tax credit ELI units, Multifamily Homeless Preference units & OPH. With Miami-Dade's PHA, our CoC has locally funded stand-alone support services to couple w/HCV's to create a PSHlike program for veterans & chronically homeless persons based on homeless longevity & need. Also, w/Miami-Dade's PHA, CoC identified local funding to rehabilitate units of Public Housing in exchange for referral rights. The CoC partnered w/the Hialeah Housing Authority to promote Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) Program to both homeless & move-up households, promoting homeownership & credit repair. An FSS video was produced which is shown to all referral households at initial intake. The PHA & CoC launched its Move-Up Strategy w/Housing Authority of the City of Miami Beach & together created a Move-Up Handbook & Assessment Tool. The partnership received a 2019 Best Practices Award by the Florida Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials. In March 2021, HUD TA, CSH, invited Miami-Dade's CoC to participate in a national Move-Up webinar. CoC has used HUD Field Office to make PHA introductions, proactively partnered w/PHA's on solicitations and MOU's, ensured timely referrals, presented at landlord engagement events, continually seeks increased allocations and assist w/troubleshooting. 2. 1. Per our CES standards, CoC Housing Coordinator refers to all PHA/CoC setaside units of HCV, PBV, Mainstream, EHV & Public Housing. CES standards, Orders of Priority for PH (RRH, PSH and OPH) & MOU's w/each PHA define how referrals are prioritized & made. All policies are posted on CoC website. HMIS is programmed to automate the prioritization of households. When households call the PHA's believing they qualify for preferences, calls are referred to CoC for further review. For new EHV's, the CoC leveraged service fees from PHA's to centralize the application process, ensure completed packages to PHA's & provide housing navigation. The CoC contracts w/Chapman Partnership to provide housing navigation to homeless clients referred to EHV, assist w/EHV applications, inc. intake scheduling and application packages completeness. Bi-weekly housing surges are occurring w/CoC/PHA/Chapman to expedite lease-up. The CoC shares data w/PCWA to ensure youth & eligible families in the CoC are referred to FYI or FUP. Updated Orders of Priority for referral developed w/HUD TA consider length of time homeless, other system involvement, history of violence, youth, seniors, families, veterans and VI-SPDAT score. 2. Our CoC has formal MOU's w/all 4 PHAs in Miami-Dade for set asides & preferences, including Public Housing, FYI, FUP, HCV, Mainstream Vouchers & EHV. All referrals are made by the CoC's Housing Coordinator. Public Housing, HCV, EHV and other set-asides have a Move-On preference for persons in PSH. RRH clients who need continuous rental assistance to avoid returning to homelessness are bridged to Section 8, as are PSH clients who no longer need intensive support services. EHV also allows CES referrals of unsheltered persons, sheltered persons & persons in licensed DV program w/prioritization of persons bridging from RRH.

1. Our CoC has worked with local PHA's (Miami-Dade, Hialeah, Miami Beach, Homestead) to apply for FUP, FYI, Mainstream Vouchers for non-elderly disabled persons and EHV funding opportunities. The CoC also work City of Miami and Carrfour Supportive Housing to apply for Mainstream Vouchers. 2. All the applications were approved. 3. Our CoC has gained more than 1,000 OPH vouchers benefiting persons experiencing homelessness who were referred using HMIS data by our CoC Housing Coordinator. This work is in addition to our leveraging Public Housing, PBV, HCV homeless preferences, as it includes tax credit set-asides, Multifamily Homeless Preference units and OPH. In one circumstance, our CoC has funded stand-alone support services with local funding to couple with the HCV homeless set-aside units to create a PSH-like program for veterans and chronically homeless persons. Our CoC Housing Coordinator makes coordinated referrals to all homeless preferences. A recent look at our HMIS data reveals no chronically homeless families with minor children in our CoC.

The CoC makes coordinated referrals to all PH and tracks in HMIS returned/rejected referrals (which are rare) in real time by project to understand the reason(s) for any returns, identify trends and barriers to entry. Non-CoC funded PH, including ES, TH and SH, are also monitored in real time by the

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CoC and SO teams to ensure clients can gain access to crisis housing and permanent housing without service participation requirements or barriers to entry. Expectations are delineated in the CoC's Systemwide Housing First Framework, updated in September 2020, and posted on the Trust's website. The CoC developed a by-name list using HMIS that tracks length of time from referral to placement and holds case staffing meetings at least monthly to troubleshoot barriers. Providers are rated during the NOFO based on their ability to quickly house persons referred. Being Housing First oriented is a threshold requirement for renewal and new projects. The CoC has used HUD's Housing First Assessment Tool to evaluate CoC programs. We perform annual risk assessments and review each project at least once every three years to monitor their adherence to HUD policies, including Housing First. We offer grievance procedures to all program participants to prevent evictions and returns to homelessness, and at times laterally transfer between PSH programs when their needs are not being met by a particular provider. We also recently enhanced our client satisfaction data collection strategies allowing program participants to scan a QR code and provide feedback on their program at any time.

Miami Beach SO does the same for its geography. SO teams also answer the Homeless Helpline & have city-issued vehicles to transport clients. Teams respond to calls from police, parks, transit, constituents & others. Fixed SO Access Points are in place for unsheltered, vets, youth & DV victims. Teams include persons w/lived experience & are trained in Crisis Intervention, Motivational Interviewing & Trauma-Informed Care. 2. Miami & Miami Beach SO cover 100% of the CoC's geography. 3. SO is provided weekdays during business hours w/bi-weekly evening SO performed year-round. Specialized SO teams engage some SMI clients daily to regulate prescribed medications. 4. 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Three, new ESG-CV SO teams w/peer specialists focus on persons w/substance use disorders. Partnering FQHC provides SO primary care services & SAMHSA's PATH engages SMI persons, inc. those discharged from crisis units (CSU) & detox. The CoC has an MOU w/courts, hospitals, CSU's & the jail w/dedicated SO to prevent discharges into homelessness. Two homeless resource officer teams make referrals to CoC programs. We engage street feeders & religious groups to use HMIS & serve as SO. SO teams are culturally competent & offer trilingual services (English, Spanish, Creole). Rapport is created w/service resistant through regular, ongoing engagement and SO offers of coffee, meals, shoes and PPE. In March 2021, Miami Lighthouse offered a CoC-wide orientation & mobility training for serving blind persons. All SO teams use HMIS, serve as access points & make referrals to ES, TH, SH. SO clients are referred to PH based on Orders of Priority for referral.

SO teams answer the Homeless Helpline & have city-issued vehicles to respond to calls & proactively canvas areas & transport clients. Teams also respond to calls from police, parks, transit & others. SO Access Points (walk-in sites), posted on CoC website, are in place for unsheltered, vets, youth & DV victims. 2. SO includes persons w/lived experience & are trained in Crisis Intervention, Motivational Interviewing & Trauma-Informed Care & are supported by specialized outreach teams providing primary care & behavioral health services who reach people who are least likely to apply for homeless assistance. SO teams prioritize unaccompanied youth, seniors, families w/minor children & vets for ES placement. CoC uses data collected in HMIS to prioritize most in need of assistance for PH. Because the vast majority of new PH funding is COVID related, we amended CES to prioritize persons who are either 65 or older or have a condition identified by CDC which makes them highly vulnerable to severe illness. The CoC performs a Racial Disparity Quantitative Assessment annually. We amended CES process after comparing racial equity pre- and 6 & 12 months post to ensure the new CES process was not having an adverse effect on providing people of color access to PH. Our system observed that people of color represent 57% of all new referrals while the US census suggests they are 18% of the general population. The CoC itself is equitable, 58% of people who exit to permanent destinations are people of color. The CoC was also 1 of 10 communities selected to be part of A Way Home America's Grand Challenge which focused on ending youth homelessness for youth of color and LGTBQ youth. CoC participation helped lead our intentional work to better understand root causes. We reviewed CoC Standards, policies and procedures for racial bias & embedded new language addressing equity. We facilitate trainings on racial bias and equity & work w/the community to identify steps to eliminate race as a social determinate of homelessness. We adopted procurement & contract monitoring practices designed to promote racial equity, including diversity requirements for selection committees; included bonus points in solicitations for proposers that have racial equity goals/statements & reviewed composition of their Board/staff; required an agency Racial Equity Plan prior to contracting. In FY 20-21, we began wrapping up risk assessments with our contracted providers asking about adopted racial equity statements; racial composition of board/staff; steps taken to identify/understand underlying causes. An pandemic-related partnership w/an all women, black owned boutique hotel in Overtown resulted in national recognition w/owner receiving the 2020 TripSavvy Editors' Choice Award in the Community Leaders category. This partnership furthered efforts to address procurement barriers experienced by small organization & those led by people of color. A Racial Equity section has been added to CoC website.

The CoC contracted with 3 hotels, an ALF and a vacant program formerly used for TH to add in excess of 500 beds of non-congregate shelter (NCS) to place COVID positive & suspected unsheltered persons seeking isolation/quarantine. Quarantine/Isolation Policy developed to address cleaning & disinfection, PPE, priority for referral, staffing, meal delivery, waste disposal, wellness checks, signage, etc. Unsheltered persons tested & referred to ES/TH or directly to PH w/2 negative PCR. Persons 65 older or people who have vulnerable health condition(s) are referred directly to PH. We erected COVID testing & vaccines at NCS, ES and TH programs & implemented ongoing testing regimen every 2-3 weeks. Persons in NCS were added to HMIS & considered for referral to PH based on the CoC Orders of Priority. As we became more sophisticated in collaborating w/FI Dept. of Health (FDOH) & documenting vaccines in HMIS, unsheltered persons were cleared for direct placement into ES/TH. SO teams screened for symptoms, distributed face masks/hand sanitizer/educational materials on COVID-19/social distancing/personal hygiene practices. Mobile PCR testing/vaccines w/FL Div. of Emergency Management. 2. Persons in ES who test positive for COVID, close contacts & persons who exhibit symptoms were referred to NCS for isolation/quarantine. Shelter case managers were co-located at NCS & partnered w/nurses to provide continuous services geared towards housing. When clients returned to ES, they required 2 negative COVID tests. Social distancing and masking enforced. CoC led mask donation drive w/community groups. CoC provided temperature kiosks, sanitizer & PPE to ES & TH. 3. Persons in TH who test positive for COVID, close contacts and persons who exhibits symptoms were referred to NCS for isolation. These clients typically

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returned to TH once they had two negative COVID tests. CoC led at least weekly calls w/ES, TH, SO, PH & health partners. CDC, FDOH & HUD guidance pushed to all, as updated.

CoC developed COVID-19 Quarantine and Isolation Policies & Procedures to address cleaning, disinfecting, waste collection, screening & testing, health monitoring & support services, discharge planning, HMIS tracking, etc. We enhanced our Continuity of Operations Plan to better address public health emergencies including chain-of-command protocols, employee health reporting guidance & processes to maintain operations remotely. PPE & other pandemic related

supplies are stockpiled, warehoused and ready to be deployed as needed. Public healthcare & FQHC partnerships developed with experts embedded in or making regular rounds at all congregate and non-congregate sites, as well as unsheltered encampments focused on COVID, flu and Hep A. CoC facilitated upgrades at congregate shelter sites, including touchless digital thermometer kiosks, UV lighting & uniform social distancing signage. CoC created email group and instituted regular virtual meetings w/providers & partners to provide updates, proactively push out guidance & share best practices & emergency response strategies. Connections w/local and state emergency managers & health officials w/liaisons dedicated exclusively to the CoC; new relationships formed w/hoteliers and others offering non-congregate sheltering options; emergency vendors established to provide lodging, food, security, cleaning and case management services. The CoC, housing & legal advocates, government agencies & others formed the Greater Miami Housing Alliance to develop homeless prevention & response strategies. Permanent housing policies updated to prioritize those at highest risk for severe illness, including seniors, those w/underlying conditions & other marginalized persons. CARES Act. ARP and other local resources obligated to the CoC to expand permanent housing capacity, including the acquisition & rehab of two new permanent housing sites w/a total of 225 units for highly vulnerable unsheltered persons.

To contain the spread COVID and promote safety in our community the CoC coordinated with all entitlement jurisdictions (Miami-Dade, Hialeah, Miami), the State and HUD TA to solicit and obtain additional specialized SO, HP and RRH through ESG-CV. SO focused on encampments providing education, testing, vaccines, counseling, and referrals. 2. ERAP and eviction protections allowed us to focus the lion's share of CV1 resources to housing (RRH) unsheltered persons and exiting persons from ES/TH (prioritizing those most vulnerable to COVID). We also established MOUs to ensure persons in ESG HP/RRH who could not sustain their rents could transition to PHA assisted housing. The CoC coordinated all referrals to ESG-CV RRH & bridge to OPH opportunities. 3. The CoC coordinated with all entitlement jurisdictions, the State and HUD TA in order to ensure ERAP was being utilized to prevent homelessness whenever possible. We jointly reviewed and amended CoC standards of care for HP, setting priorities to ensure persons served had the greatest need. Along with HUD TA and Entitlement Jurisdictions, the CoC provided ESG stakeholders with training on administering HP, and using ERAP when appropriate. At initial encounter w/persons experiencing homelessness, outreach & designated access points inquire about vaccine status, use HMIS to indicate vaccines status (1st, & when applicable, 2nd dose dates scheduled & received) & brand, upload vaccine card, if available, and check with FL Dept. of Health (FDOH) liaison when results are unable to be confirmed. Non-vaccinated status is not a barrier to entry or housing prioritization. CoC providers, w/emphasis on ES, share client lists w/FDOH regularly to update vaccinated percentages within shelters and identify those who remain unvaccinated. FDOH IIS system also records housing status when persons is experiencing homelessness. Clients sign waivers to share information. FDOH confers daily w/CoC, guarantine & isolation point of contact, ES providers & outreach to troubleshoot. Vaccine events regularly held at quarantine/isolation and congregate sites w/client receiving first dose and 2nd dose reminders, along w/continued one-on-one engagement w/those who are hesitant to the vaccine. Health professionals & persons w/lived experience serve as vaccine ambassadors. Incentives (gift cards, socks, t-shirts) & educational materials offered to those not vaccinated. Vaccines sites also easily accessible in geographically diverse locations, along transit corridors & historically underserved neighborhoods. CoC providers were charged w/doing extensive inreach to get clients scheduled for vaccine appointments at public hospital sites and emergency management pods which prioritized CoC clients, and provide transport, if needed, to vaccine sites. FDOH called to canvas clients in PH with known outbreaks (rare) to educate and encourage vaccination. Healthcare for the Homeless grantees (Camillus Health) visit unsheltered/encampments to schedule appointments at urgent care, FQHC clinics, providing transport as needed. FL Div. of Emergency Mgmt. coordinated with CoC on mobile testing at encampments, indoor feedings sites, day center locations and shelters.

Miami-Dade observed an increase in DV related Homeless Helpline calls and contacts at the Coordinated Victims Assistance Center (FY19 N=1674, FY20 N=1852 & FY21 N=2384). Helpline staffing enhanced to triage cases. The CoC provided Community Action and Human Services Department's (CAHSD) DV division with new ESG-CV funds in excess of \$1 million for RRH, to serve persons fleeing DV and human trafficking. CAHSD spent the ESG-CV 1&2 state RRH allocations and in September received reallocation dollars from PHCD, an entitlement ESG jurisdiction, in order to continue their progress w/survivors of

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DV and human trafficking. CoC also worked with all PHA's (Miami-Dade, Hialeah, Homestead, Miami Beach) and looked at DV data to make percentage of EHV vouchers available to DV victims, including CAHSD and Mujer (Homestead).

Last year, we worked with HUD TA to review the CES and make changes that aligned with the receipt of ESG-CV funding. Ahead of the pandemic we prioritized persons with the longest length of time homeless and a VI-SPDAT score of 4 or greater for RRH and 8 or greater for PSH (with a Chronic Homeless preference for PSH). The new prioritization strategy utilized data collected in HMIS to rank persons based on the following priorities: (1) seniors 65 or older, (2) persons with health conditions identified by the CDC as vulnerable to death with COVID, (3) people experiencing chronic homelessness OR reported length of time greater than 400 days OR actual HMIS length of time exceeding 300 days, (4) people with high crisis system utilization (foster care, crisis, jail...), (5) we made the VI-SPDAT threshold for both RRH and PSH 4 or greater, (6) persons fleeing DV, (7) homeless youth, and (8) highly vulnerable families. We issued guidance and held provider trainings together with Entitlement Jurisdictions on HUD waivers and alternative requirements for ESG. We built ESG RRH budgets with more intensive case management and housing navigation to better serve more vulnerable clients. Coordinating all RRH referrals through the CoC Housing Coordinator helped to close lingering side doors. RRH Standards of Care of Priority were updated accordingly. HMIS was automated to prioritize referrals and document ready module was added. We gained additional PH resources through new EHV MOUs with PHAs and prioritized PSH Move-Up and RRH bridging to PH. Move-On strategy freed up PSH for Chronic Homeless persons and families. We added staff to facilitate increased CES referrals to ESG-CV and EHVs.

1. During the competition, we used the most recent HUD rating and ranking tool provided at the time, v.4.1, to rate renewal respondents. We developed our own tool to rate and select new project applications. On the custom tool we looked at high special needs by rating how providers a) plan to address barriers to entry for chronic homeless, b) solicited feedback from persons with lived experience in the program design, and c) we looked at SyS PMs for like projects operated by the provider, with custom criteria for DV projects. New applicants that did not participate in HMIS & DV providers submitted data from other sources to address their ability to serve high special needs clients & achieve SyS PM. The performance data reviewed to rate non-DV, new project applications included rate of exits to PH, change in client income and financial utilization for past projects. Orders of Priority for referral to PH utilize LOT homeless. Our strategy is to leverage all available resources to sustain and increase PSH and OPH including ESG, HOME, SHIP, Multifamily Homeless Preference, Tax Credit referrals, HCV, PBV, EHV, Mainstream Vouchers for non-elderly disabled, FUP, FYI and VASH; advocate for the state to increase Sadowski Affordable Housing, ESG, TANF & Challenge Grant funds which provide additional PH to our CoC; invest local F&B Tax dollars to create new PH or provide support services to PHA set-asides; employ a Director of Landlord Recruitment and Retention to work w/developers/property managers/investors/providers to facilitate the identification of new housing; commit local funds, and together w/ARP HOME funding and newly created Miami Foundation Ending Homelessness Fund, acquire and operate new CoC PH/PSH: advocate for increased local F&B through local ballot initiative and state legislative amendment. We also use StellaP for a system perspective of what type of households, race and other demographics are related to those who are returning more frequently. 2. We have established a Performance Evaluation Committee to look at system and provider level performance. The PEC places providers who are above the mean for returns on performance improvement. We have implemented new rental asst standards incorporating low barrier practices & Housing 1st to promote housing retention. Our competitive solicitations look at rate of returns to select providers w/the best performance and reallocate or place poor performing providers on performance improvement. New monitoring procedures use performance as part of the risk assessment. Grievance standards provide tenants w/restorative justice hearings to mediate and promote fewer returns.

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Our CoC has transferred tenants to other agencies providing other PH/PSH when appropriate to avoid returns. We have established standards for support service costs to ensure new projects offer minimum support services to avoid returns. Providers have started to tie employee evaluations to project level SyS PM. Our RentConnect program has provided tenants who report living in unsafe housing with more housing options promoting PH retention. 3. CareerSource makes available one-stop employment centers co-located at or near ES facilities; sends mobile employment units to ES facilities & has championed supportive employment opportunities, inc. Tech Hire, for CoC youth. MCV has provided living wage jobs to CoC clients & the CoC has engaged in "Benefit Cliffs" discussion where families receiving public benefits assistance are discouraged from pursuing opportunities to gain more income due to fear of losing aid. The CoC also promoted new ARP investments in workforce development, inc. an enhanced Miami employment program that hires formerly homeless, city vendor on-the-job training/apprenticeship program, and incorporating hiring of homeless in projects that receive city funding. 2. The CoC's private sector partner expanded supportive employment staff and has stablished an employment committee of their board. They are developing a training center in partnership with FIU and Lennar to train clients in the construction trade and place in career oriented. technical, well-paying jobs. All ES/TH providers have created employment, training & volunteer opportunities, as well as partnered w/employers to create job opportunities for participants. The CoC owns land where a PSH program & farm were built. It is designed to employ formerly homeless at the farm & farmer's market. CoC led the charge to forge relationships w/employers who provide a veteran preference. As a result, the CoC has advocated for a Social Enterprise Academy (SEA) that combines life skills education with practical training for individuals experiencing homelessness which includes 1) Early Childhood Development (soft skills training, financial literacy, technology learning) 2) Workforce Trades Program (carpentry, plumbing, electric, patient care) and 3) Entrepreneurial Programming (9-months to foster new endeavor business plans). SEA is combined with an app to monitor/coach graduates through video-calling. 2. CoC has an MOU with CareerSource (Workforce Investment Board) to provide technical training and access to education and jobs. We have an MOU with Miami Job Corps to provide youth focused training & employment opportunities. We have an MOU with the Beacon Council, the local economic development organization, who has awarded funds to CoC providers to promote hiring of employment specialists & create access to gainful employment to un/underemployed clients. Florida Dept. of Education funded Victory for Youth is also working with the CoC to provide vocational rehab to homeless clients, including those unsheltered. The CoC's private sector partner is working with Florida International University and Lennar Homes to provide unskilled clients with training in the construction trades and job placement, and a partnership with the Downtown Development Authority is placing ES clients in jobs. CareerSource has accessible one-stop employment centers countywide, two mobile supportive employment units (one at our South-Dade Homeless Assistance Center) & they have collocated staff at a central access point.

Earlier this year, the CoC advocated with the state Dept. of Children and Families for a new ACCESS community partner and site to offer food assistance, temp. cash assistance, Medicaid, SNAP and refugee services. The partner also became at SO Access Point and was trained to enter homeless clients into HMIS. 2. The CoC has established funding standards in

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new PH in order to embed more supportive employment and SOAR trained case management. In partnership w/the Substance Abuse and Mental Health managing entity, we continue to conduct annual SOAR training to facilitate expedited disability benefit applications. SOAR training is also made available online to allow for greater participation by contracted providers and their employees. PH Standards incorporate the use of SOAR to expedite disability applications for participants of the CoC program. Providers enter SOAR application data into the OAT system which has demonstrated a significant reduction in the time it takes to approve public benefits. 1. Carrfour currently has a Rapid Re-Housing program that uses a landlord pool to access vacant units, we often have units that are turnkey ready for occupancy. If the survivors do not wish to take the units we have ready, they will work with our housing specialist who will assist them in the housing search process. If needed we can have a realtor work with applicants to quickly access units that meet their safety plan needs. 2.THOP RRH Expansion will solely take referrals from the CoC Housing Coordinator which may include DV survivors in HMIS, emergency transfers, and survivors referred through the CES from a DV access point. 3. The THOP RRH Expansion Coordinator will develop a housing stability and safety plan for each program participant during screening. The project budget embeds the following support services: case manager/advocate, housing search and counseling services/navigator, child care, educational services, employment assistance and job training, food, legal services, life skills

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training, healthcare inclusive of mental health and transportation. 4.The project is designed to empower survivors to engage in safe, income earning opportunities that will allow them to transition into market rent. When that is not possible, the CoC has a move on preference that allows survivors to access PSH and OPH (i.e. HCV, EHV..).

1.Carrfour ensures that staff are trained to ensure confidentiality and safety to all our applicants and residents. Program staff are required to complete the DCF's Core Competency training, which includes Safety Planning, Risk Assessments, and Confidentiality. 2. Survivors are interviewed alone, in a private, locked office or conference room at the intake facility. 3. Other adults are asked to wait in the lobby while the safety plan is being completed with the survivor. 4. Survivors from Miami-Dade county, who chose to remain in the county, are provided housing options in neighborhoods distant from the aggressor. 5. Housing Specialists perform property inspections at move-in, as needed but no less than annually. Advocates perform site visits no less than monthly. Resident or staff report safety issues to the supervisor and landlord when appropriate. 6. Residents are referred and added anonymously into the HMIS project (no names are visible to other end users) and addresses are not labelled in shelterpoint (the HMIS bedlist), checks requests, reports, etc. Safety plans are completed prior to program entry.

Residents were added to HMIS anonymously and addresses are not labelled in Shelterpoint. A safety plan was completed at intake and reviewed no less than monthly with the survivor. Staff are trained and required to do ongoing training to ensure we are providing the necessary services and confidentiality/safety

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protocols are met. Monthly meetings are held with all program staff to ensure that safety, confidentiality and needs of the resident are met. In cases where the aggressor discovered the resident's location, temporary emergency housing (DV shelter, hotel or family/friend home) was provided to ensure immediate safety. The resident was then assisted by the Services Coordinator and Housing Specialist to transfer to another property that meets their safety needs and honors their housing choice.

 Carrfour has a RRH program that serves 36 homeless families. All referrals for this program are received from the Miami Dade County Coordinated entry system. The Program Director or Assistant Program Director receives the referral and then assigns the case one of the Resident Services Coordinators/Advocates that will contact the survivor to begin the process for housing placement. The Resident Services Coordinators/Advocates assist applicants/survivors completing required documentation. RRH provides financial assistance and services to help families who are experiencing homelessness including families fleeing domestic violence. The families we serve are to be quickly re-housed and stabilized. Based on a determination of need, such assistance may be in the form of move-in expenses, rental assistance, housing search and placement assistance and housing stability case management. We use a landlord pool to access vacant units and we often have units that are turnkey ready occupancy. If the survivors do not wish to take the units we have ready, they will work with our housing specialist who will assist them in the housing search process. If needed we have a realtor work with survivors to quickly access units that meet their housing choice and safety plan needs. 2. Carrfour supervises and trains staff in the fidelity of Housing First principles, trauma informed care, harm reduction, motivational interviewing and critical time intervention. We use these evidence-based techniques to ensure exceptional service to our residents. If at any given time an applicant or resident feels dissatisfied that they have been declined or denied access to housing and/or services, or dissatisfied with the services they have received by

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staff, we have a grievance policy in place for it to be addressed so that they can file a grievance. We also have residents fill a client satisfaction survey every year to check in our services delivery model. 3. The Resident Services Coordinator/Advocate provides every new resident with written information on trauma resources included but not limited to the Trauma Resolution Center, Coordinated Victims Assistance Center and inhouse restorative practices at intake. 4. Program assessments and clinical staff interventions are strengthbased. For example, Housing Stability plans are designed to empower residents to find housing and meaning work/volunteer opportunities that matches their strengths, and are likely to promote improved quality of life. 5. Carrfour has taken the following steps address racial disparities in our work, which includes a review of our policies and procedures for racial bias and embed new language addressing equity. We are assessing our operations and services policies to ensure that we are identifying potential disparities that may affect housing stability, provision of services, and access to less restrictive housing for the persons of color that we serve. Further, we have reviewed how we promote the hiring and internal advancement of persons with lived experiences and persons of color in all roles of our organization and have implemented specific a mentorship program to provide professional development and training to staff interested in advancing in their role at Carrfour. However, this is not sufficient and our commitment to promoting racial equity and reduce racial disparities will continue throughout our organization and we have expanded this effort to address needs of LGTBQ+ residents in the provision of housing and services delivery. Carrfour has always had a strong focus on diversity and inclusion in our hiring and provision of services that includes affirming language, reducing or removing gender specific pronouns in our documents and applications, and having a zero-tolerance policy for any discriminatory, homophobic, transphobic or gender expression harassment or bullying. However, we are a work in progress and continue to assess, learn and become educated through training offered by local organizations serving the LGTBQ community. Pridelines, who has been serving the South Florida LGTBQ community for over 30 years, conducted a series of agency wide trainings this year addressing issues affecting LGTBQ+ employees and residents. They also provide onsite services for our community members. Last year we opened the first in Florida -LGTBQ+ focused supportive housing community for seniors in Wilton Manors. All staff, from security staff to service providers to property management- were required to go through an intensive training offered by SAGE, a national advocacy and services organization focused on LGBTQ elders. This training addressed the specific service needs that affect housing stability for LGBTQ elders. 6. Through restorative justice circles, survivors have an opportunity forgroup work, mentorship, and peer-to-peer support. 7. Staff assist residents to access Early Learning Coalition for childcare. We are budgeted for life skills, inclusive of parenting classes.

1.Support services include a Resident Services Coordinator/Advocate who develops a housing

stability and safety plan for each program participant during intake. Resident Services Coordinators/Advocates conduct home visits and maintain safety planning while connecting residents to services that promote housing stability. Our Housing Specialist facilitates housing search and rapid placement. The budget includes child care, educational services, employment assistance and job training which leverages the CoC MOU with CareerSource of South Florida, food, legal

services through Legal Services of Greater Miami who may assist with custody issues and restraining orders, life skills training inclusive of financial wellness provided by Wells Fargo, healthcare inclusive of mental health and transportation. 2. Carrfour has seen a steady increase in persons fleeing DV in their CoC funded RRH program (n=21% for 2019, n=27% for 2020 and n=30% for 2021). Currently we provide housing stability planning and housing navigation. Our Housing Specialist provides survivors with a list of properties that are move-in ready. If the client choses, they search for additional properties and use a realtor when necessary. We currently partner with Career Source of South Florida to provide access to educational services, employment assistance and job training. We budget for educational services, for example, we have paid for a survivor to obtain a security guard license. We partner with Legal Services of Greater Miami to assist survivors with child custody and other legal services. We partner with Betterway and PsychSolutions to offer survivors and their family behavioral health services. We budget to offer survivors financial assistance with co-pays and transportation to services.



**Displacement Due to Government Action.** Families living in Miami-Dade County displaced or at risk of being displaced due to a governmental action, including Public Housing Development Plans, must be referred and verified. The referral for Housing Choice Voucher assistance must be made within six (6) months of the displacement in order for such families to qualify for Housing Choice Voucher assistance. Written referrals may also be accepted from USHUD, appropriate federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, the State Attorney's Office, or by the courts, including requests for assistance for eligible clients under witness protection.

**Homeless** – In an effort to address the risk of homelessness, PHCD may collaborate with the Homeless Trust on referrals of persons transitioning out of a shelter, transitional housing program, rapid re-housing program or permanent supportive housing.

Veterans – PHCD, at its sole discretion, may provide an admission preference over new admissions to applicants whose head or co-head are eligible veterans. A veteran is a person who:

- had at least 180 days of regular active duties and was honorably discharged or released; or
- had at least 90 days of active duty service, of which at least one (1) day of service was in a war conflict and was honorably discharged or released; or
- served in a war conflict and was awarded a Purple Heart or became disabled, regardless of completion of days of active duty.

The veteran status extends to spouses, widows, widowers and parents of the military killed during a time of war. Applicants claiming a veteran's preference must provide a copy military service record, proof of service, or the discharge documents (Form DD214) of the veteran for whom the preference is claimed.

**Mainstream Preference** – This preference is specific for non-elderly persons with disabilities who are homeless per 24 C.F.R. 576.2 or transitioning out of institutional and other segregated settings or are at serious risk of institutionalization.

# ii. Income Targeting Requirement [24 CFR 982.201(b)(2)]

HUD requires that extremely low-income (ELI) families make up at least 75 percent of the families admitted to the HCV program during the PHA's fiscal year. ELI families are those with annual incomes at or below the federal poverty level or 30 percent of the area median income, whichever number is higher. To ensure this requirement is met, a PHA may skip non-ELI families on the waiting list in order to select an ELI family.

Low-income families admitted to the program that are "continuously assisted" under the 1937 Housing Act [24 CFR 982.4(b)], as well as low-income or moderate-income families admitted to the program that are displaced as a result of the prepayment of the mortgage or voluntary termination of an insurance contract on eligible low-income housing, are not counted for income targeting purposes [24 CFR 982.201(b)(2)(v)].

# PHCD Policy

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- (4) The opening and closing of registration periods will be advertised on social media platforms, newspaper publications and the radio for the purpose of reaching all segments of the community and providing advanced notice.
- (5) PHCD may choose from various options regarding when and how to open, administer, and populate the waiting, subject to approval by the Board.
- (6) Some of these options may include an exclusive electronic open waiting list, where ranking is based on the date and time of application or any applicable factors that the agency may adopt, subject to approval by the Board.
- (7) Placement on the Waiting List

PHCD will determine the number of applications to be selected for placement on the waiting list based on historical and empirical data. The waiting list number represents the number of applications that need to be reviewed in order to result in the issuing of enough vouchers to absorb all underlying funding within a 12 to 18-month period. After that, subject to the Board of County Commissioners' approval, the list will be reopened.

PHCD will select applicants to be placed on the waiting list via an electronic drawing and random selection process. The applicants will be placed on the waiting list in order of the assigned numbers and according to PHCD admission preference(s) described in this chapter.

Those families not selected from the pool for placement on the waiting list will be sent a notice that they were not selected, informing that they may apply the next time PHCD's waiting list is open.

- (8) Subject to approval by the Board, PHCD proposes to establish site-based waiting lists for its Section 8 Project-Based Voucher Program and pursuant to the following policies:
  - Interested families will apply with PHCD.
  - Adopted admission preferences will be available for applicants to request during open registration.

Note that under the site-based waiting list approach, families apply for the properties that best meets their needs, such as access to employment, family support, school, public transportation, hospital, medical facility, etc. Implementing a site-based waiting list will expedite leasing process as families are only referred to properties, they expressed interest in residing.

# (a) Initial Process

Subject to approval by the Board, existing applicant families on the 2008 Tenant-Based waiting list will be provided an opportunity to select and apply for the properties that best meets their needs prior to opening the waiting list to the general public.

- (b) Search Time
- The initial term of the Section 8 voucher continues to be 60 days from the date of voucher issuance. PHCD may extend the initial term for 60 additional days not to exceed an overall total of 120 days in accordance with the Section 8 Administrative Plan.
- The voucher term may be extended beyond 120-day as a reasonable accommodation.

# b) Admission Preference

(1) Admission preferences include:

- Veterans
- Homeless referred by the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust pursuant to the executed memorandum of understanding.

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# 1-I.E. THE PHA'S COMMITMENT TO ETHICS AND SERVICE

# INTRODUCTION - Project-Based Assistance (PBA)

This section applies to units developed or rehabilitated under the Section 8 Project-Based Assistance (PBA) Program and placed under an annual HAP contract between the owner and HACMB. The term of the contract is concurrent with the term of the funding increment under which the units were developed, but the contract can be renewed if the funding increment is renewed. Except with respect to the following, HACMB's policies for these units are the same as those for the HCV tenant-based program.

HACMB's PBA Program is located at the following:

Harding Village, 8500 Harding Avenue, Miami Beach, FL 33141, consists of 20 zero (0)bedroom units designated for formerly homeless, disabled individuals. The preference for this program is:

# Homeless and Disabled

- When a PBA unit becomes vacant, the Owner is required to refer an applicant from its waiting list to HACMB to determine eligibility. If the applicant's name appears on another HACMB housing program waiting list, their name will not be removed from that list.
- If the Owner leases a vacant unit anytime after the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month, HACMB will
  prorate the rent for that month starting the date the tenant moves in.
- 3. Owners who do not make required repairs to a PBA unit within 90 days will have their HAP contract terminated or, in the case of multiple units under one HAP contract, have their contract amended to exclude the unit.
- Families living in PBA units that are terminated for Owner non-compliance or Owner opt-out will have their form of assistance converted to a Section 8 voucher.

# Chapter 19

# SECTION 8 MODERATE REHABILITATION SINGLE ROOM OCCUPANCY PROGRAM FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS [24 CFR 882, Subpart H]

# INTRODUCTION

The following shall constitute the Housing Authority of the City of Miami Beach's (HACMB) policies and procedures for the implementation of the Section 8 Moderate Rehabilitation Single Room Occupancy (SRO) Program for Homeless Individuals. These procedures are in accordance with 24 CFR 882, Subpart H and are in conjunction with the Section 8 Administrative Plan. The designated Public Housing Agency (PHA) shall be the administering agency for the SRO Moderate Rehabilitation Program for HACMB.

The purpose of the program is to provide rental assistance targeting very low income elderly homeless persons, but not excluding an otherwise eligible person on the basis of age, in rehabilitated SRO housing. The housing assistance payments to owners/providers will be equal to the rent of the unit, including utilities, minus the tenant(s) portion of the rent payable by the tenant(s). The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (US HUD) will make the assistance available for ten (10) years for each SRO project.

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All evictions must be carried out through the Judicial Process under State and local law. An owner/provider must not terminate or refuse to renew the lease except on the grounds identified under the Termination of Tenancy Section of this Administrative Plan.

# XII. PARTICIPATION OF HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS

Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust ("Trust"), in compliance with its Charter, will ensure that at least one homeless or formerly homeless person is on the board of directors, or otherwise involved in consideration of policies and decisions. The Trust will involve, to the maximum extent feasible, homeless persons in employment, volunteer services, constructing or rehabilitating property, and in providing supportive services.

#### XIII. RECORDS AND REPORTS

HACMB will make any reports as US HUD may require in the time frame required. The owner/provider will be required to provide data collection information for each participant in the format required by the PHA.

# Hialcah Housing Authority Adopted by Commission: November 14, 2017 Effective: November 14, 2017

Actual and imminent threat refers to a physical danger that is real, would occur within an immediate time frame, and could result in death or serious bodily harm. In determining whether an individual would pose an actual and imminent threat, the factors to be considered include:

- The duration of the risk;
- The nature and severity of the potential harm;
- · The likelihood that the potential harm will occur; and
- The length of time before the potential harm would occur.

Eviction or termination of assistance should only be used by HHA or owner when there are no other actions or remedies to reduce or eliminate the threat, including when actions or remedies are unavailable. This is the case even when time periods could reasonably be called "immediate." Some possible actions for HHA or owner to take to reduce or eliminate the threat are listed at 24 CFR 5.2005(d)(4). HUD encourages HHA and owners to work with local law enforcement to prevent or remedy instances where a threat may occur to better protect the victim and other tenants in the community.

HHA may consider the following actions to reduce or eliminate an "actual and imminent" threat:

- a) Barring the perpetrator from the property;
- b) Changing the victim's locks;
- c) Installing basic security features (e.g., better lighting or an alarm);
- d) Encouraging the victim to seek an emergency transfer;
- e) Allowing an early lease termination;
- f) Allowing the victim temporary absence from the assisted unit;
- g) Helping the victim access available services and support (e.g., providing information for a local victim service provider and civil legal assistance providers, to help the victim get any necessary court orders); and/or
- Working with police and victim service providers to develop a safety plan for the property and victim.

# 3-III.B.17 Establishing Waiting List Preferences

The VAWA Final Rule clarifies that HHA may establish preference for victims of dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, in addition to domestic violence. (See 24 CFR 960.206(b)(4), 982.207(b)(4).) HHA should consider whether to adopt a local preference for admission of families that include victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

HHA's system of local preferences must be based on local housing needs and priorities by using generally accepted data sources and information obtained through the PHA Plan public comment process. HUD encourages HHA to work collaboratively with health care providers, social service providers, homeless services providers, Continuums of Care (CoCs), and local offices of government and community organizations to establish a system of preferences based on local housing needs collectively identified by the community. Adopted by Board of Commissioners: August 27, 2019

# 4-II.C. OPENING AND CLOSING THE WAITING LIST [24 CFR 982.206]

# Closing the Waiting List

The HHA should consider closing its waiting list when it has insufficient funds available to assist all applicants on the waiting list over a reasonable period of time. The HHA may choose to close only a portion of its waiting list instead of the entire waiting list. For example, the HHA may continue to receive applications from families qualifying for a specific local preference category, i.e. homeless families, while closing its waiting list to all other groups.

# HHA Policy

The HHA will offer public notice when changing its preference system. The notice will be publicized using the same guidelines as those for opening and closing the wait list.

The HHA uses the following Local Preference system:

- 1. Disaster
- 2. Homelessness
- 3. Elderly or Disabled
- Non-elderly disabled applicants who are transitioning out of institutional and other segregated settings at serious risks of institutionalization, homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Preferences defined:

# 1. Disaster 25 points:

Families whose dwelling unit has been declared uninhabitable by a disaster declared or otherwise formally recognized pursuant to federal disaster laws.

# 2. Moving Up ("MU") 20 Points

- The units are specifically made available to house individuals and families that meet the definition of homeless under section 103 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11302), and contained in the Continuum of Care Interim Rule at 24 CFR 578.3.
- 2. The units are specifically made available to house families that are comprised of or include a veteran. A veteran is an individual who has served in the United States armed forces. The HHA may further define "veteran" for purposes of determining if the units are eligible for this exception. For example, HHA could require that the veteran must be eligible to receive supportive services from the Department of Veterans Affairs or require that the veteran was not dishonorably discharged. HHA requires that the veteran was not dishonorably discharged.
- 3. The units provide supportive housing to persons with disabilities or to elderly persons. The definitions of a person with disabilities and an elderly person are found at 24 CFR 5.403. Supportive housing means that the project makes supportive services available for all of the assisted families in the project and provides a range of services tailored to the needs of the residents occupying such housing. Such services may include (but are

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As required by statute, a voucher under this program that is used to provide housing assistance to a youth is time limited to a period of a maximum of 36 months. There is no statutory limitation on the time a family may receive housing assistance under this program. The Hialeah Housing Authority works in conjunction with the Florida Department of Children and Families and Our Kids Inc.

# 18.I.B. FAMILY SELF SUFFICIENCY PROGRAM.

The FSS Program coordinates existing public and private sector resources and integrated them into personal development programs to assist individuals who need coordinated help. All of our present Section 8 recipients are being offered the opportunity to participate in this program. Interested families meet with our FSS coordinator and together they develop an individual needs assessment. The Head of Household is required to participate

# 18.I.C. HOMELESS PROGRAM.

In 2016 the Hialeah Housing Authority entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Miami Dade County Homeless Trust ("Trust") where 50 Vouchers were allocated to referrals from the Trust for eligible homeless families. The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act amended by S.896 and the Homeless Emergency and Rapid Transition to Housing "(HEARTH") Act of 2009 define "homeless" as: "(a) An individual or family with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or

camping ground; (b) an individual or family living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state, or local government programs for low- income individuals); or (c) An individual who is exiting an institution where he or she resided for 90 days or less and who resided in an emergency shelter or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution." The Homeless Trust serves both as a referral and source of case management to these individuals. This Trust was subsequently amended in 2019 by adding an additional 25 vouchers to this Trust totaling 75.

# 18.I.D. MAINSTREAM FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

The purpose of the Mainstream Program is to assist non-elderly families with disabilities by providing rental assistance.

**18.I.E. NED** – the HHA has administered the Non-Elderly Disabled NED (1) Program since 2001. The program serves income eligible families whose head of household, spouse or co-head is non-elderly (under age 62) and disabled.

# 18.II.A FAMILY UNIFICATION PROGRAM (FUP)

# INTRODUCTION

The purpose of the Family Unification Program (FUP) is to promote family unification by providing a Housing Choice Voucher to families for whom the lack of adequate housing is a primary factor in the imminent placement of the family's child, or children, in out of home care; or the delay in the discharge of the child, or children, to the family from out of home care. Youths at least 18 years old and not more than 24 years old who left foster care at age 16 or older, or will leave foster care within 90 days, in accordance with a transition plan described in section 475 (5)(H) of the Social Security Act, and is homeless or is at risk of becoming homeless. As required by statute, a voucher under this program that is used to provide housing assistance to a youth is time limited to a period of a maximum of 36 months.

The HHA works in conjunction with the Florida Department of Children and Families, its subcontracted entity, Our Kids Inc. and the Miami Dade County Homeless Trust.

# **Application Waiting List**

The HHA will accept families and youths certified by Our Kids Inc. as eligible for the Family Unification Program. Upon receipt of the Our Kids Inc. list of eligible families and youths currently in their caseload, HHA will compare the names with those of families and youths currently on HHA's HCV waiting list. Any family or youth on HHA's HCV waiting list that

# 4-III.C. SELECTION METHOD

PHAs must describe the method for selecting applicant families from the waiting list, including the system of admission preferences that the PHA will use [24 CFR 982.202(d)].

# Local Preferences [24 CFR 982.207; HCV p. 4-16]

PHAs are permitted to establish local preferences, and to give priority to serving families that meet those criteria. HUD specifically authorizes and places restrictions on certain types of local preferences. HUD also permits the PHA to establish other local preferences, at its discretion. Any local preferences established must be consistent with the PHA plan and the consolidated plan, and must be based on local housing needs and priorities that can be documented by generally accepted data sources.

# **HHA Policy**

The HHA will use the following local preferences with the highest preference following the order of the numbered categories, whereas Category I will indicate the highest preference and followed by Category 2:

Category 1: Families terminated from its HCV Program due to insufficient program funding ...

Category 2: **Homelessness**: To qualify for this preference, families must qualify as homeless under the HUD Hearth Act's Category 1 definition of homeless which advises that:

- (a) An individual or family with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station. airport, or camping ground; (b) an individual or family living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state, or local government programs for low- income individuals); or (c) An individual who is exiting an institution where he or she resided for 90 days or less and who resided in an emergency shelter or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution."
- (b) The HHA has committed no less than eight (8) Vouchers to Homeless Referrals by the Miami Dade Homeless Trust.

Therefore, the HHA will first assist families that have been terminated from the HCV program due to insufficient funding and then assist families that qualify for the Homeless Preference.

If the applicant falsifies documents or makes false statements in order to qualify for a preference, they will be removed from the waiting list. All preferences will be verified.

# Income Targeting Requirement [24 CFR 982.201(b) (2)]

HUD requires that extremely low-income (ELI) families make up at least 75% of the families admitted to the HCV program during the PHA's fiscal year. ELI families are those with annual incomes at or below 30% of the area median income. To ensure this requirement is met, a PHA may skip non-ELI families on the waiting list in order to select an ELI family.

The City of Miami adopts the CoC goals, which are aligned with HUD's key system performance measures:

- Shorten the length of time persons remain homeless
- · Reduce the number of persons returning from homelessness
- · Increase income and job access for people experiencing homelessness
- Reduce the number of persons who become homeless for the first time
- Increase successful housing placements

# Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

The City will continue to support the CoC's Coordinated Entry System (CE) and Coordinated Outreach, Assessment and Placement Program (COAP) by utilizing approximately 60% of its ESG allocation to fund homeless outreach and engagement within the City of Miami with a goal of assisting approximately 3,500 persons per program year. The City will comply with the CoC's CE policies and procedures.

The City of Miami's Homeless Assistance Program (MHAP), serves as the front lines in the City's fight against homelessness and has handled street outreach services for the CoC for over a decade. MHAP receives separate funding from the Homeless Trust to provide OAP services in areas outside of City of Miami limits.

As detailed in the Miami-Dade County CoC's Coordinated Entry (CE) Process Policies & procedures, the CoC's CE process is linked to street outreach efforts so that people sleeping on the streets are prioritized for assistance in the same manner as any other person assessed through the CE process. An unsheltered client who is refusing shelter may still obtain written homeless verification and referral for services, including rental assistance focused on shortening their homeless episode in accordance with the CoC's Housing First approach. Street Outreach (SO) includes two specialized behavioral health outreach teams, Camillus House's Lazarus Project and New Horizon's PATH program. SO teams provide in-the-field assessment of unsheltered persons and provide transportation following shelter or permanent housing placement. MHAP works with the CoC's Housing Coordinator to place assessed homeless persons on By Name List(s) for permanent housing placement in accordance with the CoC's Order of Priorities. MHAP also assists persons on the street with obtaining necessary documentation (homeless verification, birth certificates, I.Ds and social security cards) and makes referrals to community services and resources. SO workers follow the HMIS workflow, which includes collection of the HMIS Notices and Disclosure and HMIS Consent to Release and Exchange of Information. SO teams also attempt to place victims of Domestic Violence (DV) in shelter designed for survivors of domestic violence.

In FY2017-2018, MHAP received 60% of the City's ESG allocation (approximately \$250,000), and assisted a total of 4,074 persons via outreach activities including 151 veterans, 30 persons fleeing domestic

violence, 369 elderly persons (62+ years of age), 122 persons with HIV/AIDS, and 265 chronically homeless persons. It also provided outreach to approximately 770 persons with disabilities, 1027 persons who are mentally ill, 639 persons with chronic substance abuse issues, and 265 persons with a chronic health condition MHAP also receives nearly \$1 million in funding for outreach activities via the Homeless Trust (CoC).

# Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The City of Miami does not operate emergency shelters/transitional housing with the exception of the Motel/Hotel Program providing immediate shelter to families with children when there no shelter beds available. Chapman Partnership, which operates the county's primary shelters, provides case management to families placed in motel/hotel. The City's MHAP teams work closely with CoC shelters to coordinate placement into available shelter beds.

The City provided \$100,000 in funding towards the Day Services Program at Camillus House designed to provide meaningful, engaging activities for a period of one (1) year, for the City's homeless, which also provides participants with mail boxes and ID services to assist with re-establishing personal identification and necessary documents. The City is looking to renew this same funding in FY19-20. In the spring of 2018, the City of Miami OMNI CRA authorized a grant of \$175,000 to Camillus House, Inc., to underwrite the costs tied to the Miami Shelter Program. Camillus has a proven track record of helping the homeless population including the chronically, along with the homeless population in the Redevelopment Area.

As of January 21, 2016, the continuum's housing inventory (year-round beds) was as follows: 1,716 emergency shelter beds, 24 safe haven beds, and 1,266 transitional beds, amounting to a total of 3,006 in this category, plus 247 overflow/voucher beds. Meanwhile, there were 3,996 permanent supportive housing beds amounting to a grand total of 7,249 beds in the continuum.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

When analyzing the data from the most recent PIT in regards to the sub-populations identified, the two characteristics found most frequently, are mental illness and substance abuse, in both the sheltered and unsheltered categories. This data would seem to indicate that a bulk of homeless persons are battling another underlying issue(s) and as such, are in need of housing and supportive services. Addressing these needs given dwindling funding on a federal, state, and local level creates several obstacles. First, establishing on-going support services for persons who are formerly homeless is difficult. Secondly, unemployment levels in South Florida continue to be some of the highest in the nation and lack of employment is a key factor in a person's ability to retain housing and finally, there is a limited supply of

affordable housing units within City limits, specifically for the very low-income. To that end, the City works within the means available and awards federal funds to supportive housing projects within City limits.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); or, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs.

The City will award approximately 30% of its ESG allocation towards CoC rapid re-housing and homeless prevention programs. Awarded providers will be required to comply with the CoC's CE policies and procedures as well as Standards of Care for both program strategies. The City will coordinate its efforts to ensure that the City's ESG funds are directed toward CoC priorities for prevention and RRH assistance.

<u>Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)</u> targets families and individuals currently in emergency housing programs or living in places not meant for human habitation, for the purposes of rapidly moving them into private market housing. Rapid rehousing programs may provide rental assistance for up to 24 months or other types of financial assistance required to secure permanent housing. Households receive supportive services on a time-limited basis, including assistance with locating, securing, and stabilizing in affordable housing so that they can independently sustain their housing after assistance ends. Rapid Re-Housing also includes bridge housing for homeless persons who qualify, but are waitlisted for placement in permanent supportive housing. RRH funded by ESG must be conducted in compliance with ESG regulations.

<u>Homelessness Prevention</u> provides cash assistance with rent and mortgages, security deposits, or utility payments, made on a case-by-case basis to help to families and individuals at risk of becoming homeless to resolve a housing crisis. Prevention funded by ESG must be conducted in compliance with ESG regulations.

# **Other activities**

In response to increased heroin overdoses, particularly in the urban core located in the City of Miami, the state authorized a needle exchange program, the only one in Florida (the IDEA Exchange Program establishes under the Florida Infectious Disease Elimination Act. The: harm-reduction focused IDEA Exchange Program is operated by the Miller School of Medicine at the University of Miami. The Homeless Trust and City participate in IDEA Exchange coordination.

In the fall of 2018, the City of Miami along with the Downtown Development Authority installed the first permanent, public bathroom for the homeless. The bathroom is attended 12 hours a day (seven days a week) by a person hired from Miami's homeless shelter who makes sure that the bathroom's rules are followed and that it remains clean. It cost just over \$300,000 and it is the first of its kind.

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

# **CHAPTER 21**

# MOVING UP PROGRAM

The HACMB has partnered with the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust ("MDHT"), lead agency for the Miami-Dade County Continuum of Care (CoC), to identify individuals and families ready to transition or "move up" from Permanent Supportive Housing ("PSH") into the HCV Program ("Moving Up Program"). These are families that were homeless prior to entry into the PSH program and who continue to need a rental subsidy but no longer require intensive supportive services.

The HACMB has allocated up to ten (10) vouchers from its Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program specifically for targeted households under the MU Program.

The HACMB will accept referrals from the CoC's Coordinated Entry Program following pre-screening by CoC PSH providers, who will use a common assessment tool to identify those individuals and families that are a good candidate for a successful transition from PSH to a HCV.

Qualifying applicants will be given absolute priority over other applicants until the number of HCVs allocated under the MU Program is reached, taking into account any additional preferences for which they qualify, and the availability of vouchers. Once these vouchers have been utilized, no additional priority will be given under the MU Program until a participating "move up" household ends participation in the HCV program, at which point the HACMB will accept a referral for a replacement "move up" eligible family for the next available voucher.

A. Eligibility for Moving Up Program

The eligibility criteria for the MU Program is:

- 1. The individual/family currently resides in CoC PSH within the City of Miami Beach or if residing in CoC PSH outside of the City of Miami Beach, has had contact with the City of Miami Beach, as evidenced by records in the Continuum of Care (CoC) Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), a local information technology system used to collect client-level data on the provision of housing and services to homeless individuals and families;
- 2. The individual/family has a stable housing history and no longer needs the intensive support of PSH as determined by the Moving Up Assessment;
- 3. The individual/ family is willing to participate in the "move-up" strategy voluntarily, understands the nature of the HCV tenant-based program, and provides a written request for Housing Choice Voucher assistance; and

- 4. The individual/family is a low-income family and otherwise eligible for the HACMB Housing Choice Voucher Program.
- 5. Local Preferences will then be applied in accordance with the HACMB HCV Program's Administrative Plan to give priority to serving families that meet those criteria.

Miami-Dade County Public Housing and Community Development (PHCD) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust, the Lead Agency for the Continuum of Care (CoC), to utilize Mainstream (Section 811) Vouchers to assist persons in transitioning out of Permanent Supportive Housing.

To date, the Homeless Trust, through its Housing Coordinator, has referred 44 non-elderly, disabled households to the Mainstream Voucher Program in line with the CoC's Move-Up Orders of Priority and PHCD's admission preference of accepting families referred by the Trust. Additionally, an amendment to PHCD's Annual Plan, currently out for public comment, is being revised to amend its Mainstream non-elderly disabled preference to include non-elderly disabled families who previously experienced homelessness and are currently in permanent supportive housing. Referrals are made in line with the jointly developed Move-Up Assessment Tool and the commitment of CoC-contracted providers to ensure housing navigation and continuing support for households, as needed. Our partnership also serves to further the goals of the Americans with Disabilities Act by helping persons with disabilities live independently in the most integrated community settings. We look forward to expanding this partnership as part of successful award in the FY 2019 Mainstream Voucher Program Competition and working with technical assistance provided by U.S. HUD through CSH to further develop our Move-Up Strategy.

#### i. OVERVIEW

 Miami Beach Community Development Corporation has adopted an admissions preference for people experiencing homelessness at the following designated affordable housing multifamily properties:

- To qualify for the admissions preference, applicants will meet the following definition of homelessness:
  - "Households that qualify as homeless under the HUD HEARTH Act<sup>1</sup>Homeless definition paragraph one: (i) those whose primary nighttime residence is not designed as a sleeping accommodation for human beings, (ii) those in shelter, transitional housing, or motels paid for by charitable organizations, and (iii) those exiting institutions after 90 days or less and who were previously homeless."
- Furthermore, all homeless households are subject to a universal screening assessment by the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust. Homeless households referred to Owner/Agent will be those households deemed best served for rapid placement into rental housing with minimal need for support.

- All applications must be provided in person or via mail reflecting an original signature.
- Screen the batch of up to three referred applicants for eligibility and suitability in the order received from the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust (i.e. Applicant #1 and Applicant #2).
- Alert the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust and applicants of any deficiencies in applications.
- Make an eligibility determination within five (5) business days.
  - 1. If an applicant is denied housing, consider mitigating documentation that may be supplied by the applicant during the appeal process.
- Respond to brief quarterly emails from the Mlami HUD Field Office asking for updates on move-ins, move-outs under the homeless preference.
- Request Miami-Dade Homeless Trust to provide service provider connections to residents in need in order to preserve their housing.
- Ensure a general timely response time for all communications with the MOU partner of not more than two (2) business days.

#### IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MIAMI-DADE HOMELESS TRUST

- Review the current waitlists at the affected sites to determine if any of the applicants meet the definition of homeless.
- Provide Owner/Agent with a batch of up to three (3) applicants that meet the property's eligibility criteria within seven (7) business days after being notified by the Owner/Agent of an available housing

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unit. If the applicants are rejected or decline an offer of housing, the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust can refer more applicants if requested by the Owner/Agent. If a suitable new applicant is not identified within five (5) business days, then the property may revert back to its standing waiting list to fill the vacancy.

- Provide the Owner/Agent with a complete referral package for each referral that includes:
  - 1. Completed housing application of the Owner/Agent.
  - 2. Required supporting documentation needed by the Owner/Agent to process applications::
    - a. Birth certificates and social security cards for ALL household members
    - b. Picture IDs for all adults
    - c. Income and asset documentation
  - 3. Verification of homelessness for the homeless preference definition.
  - 4. Determination that household scored at the lower end of a numeric scale for risk/vulnerability.
  - 5. Release of Information from the referred households to authorize the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust and the Owner/Agent to share information regarding the households' applications, including third party documents the development receives from doing third party verifications (i.e. bank statements, credit reports, etc).
- Inform the applicants referred that this is only a referral and does not constitute an offer of housing and that the Owner/Agent will confirm eligibility for the housing.
- Coordinate with the service provider to accompany the referred applicants for interviews with the Owner/Agent and lease signing at the property if the household needs that support.
- If an applicant is denied housing, coordinate with the service provider to work with the household to schedule an appeal, if desired, and assist the household to gather mitigating documentation and accompany the applicant to the appeal meeting.
- For each referral, the Mlami-Dade Homeless Trust will alert any service provider from within the local Continuum-of-Care network that has an established, active case management relationship with the household. These are support service programs, not governed or guaranteed by the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust, that are often positioned to provide <u>short term and/or long term</u> human services to the households during their new tenancy that will promote their stability as new tenants. The Miami-Dade Homeless Trust's role will be to announce news of a new housing opportunity being presented to the client of one of these organizations which could include.

## Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Between Miami-Dade Homeless Trust and Public Housing and Community Development

## I. OVERVIEW

- Public Housing and Community Development (the Owner/Agent) has adopted an admissions
  preference for people experiencing homelessness at the following designated affordable housing
  multifamily properties:
- 1. Coconut Grove (One Unit) 3/2
  - 2. Goulds (Three Units) 2/2, 3/2 and 4/2
  - 3. Miami Gardens (Two Units) 2/2
  - 4. Perrine Rainbow (Three Units) 2/1, 3/2, and 4/2
  - 5. Wynwood (Two Units) 2/2
- To qualify for the admissions preference, applicants will meet the following definition of homelessness:
  - "Households that qualify as homeless under the HUD HEARTH Act <sup>1</sup>Homeless definition paragraph one: (i) those whose primary nighttime residence is not designed as a sleeping accommodation for human beings, (ii) those in shelter, transitional housing, or motels paid for by charitable organizations, and (iii) those exiting institutions after 90 days or less and who were previously homeless."
- Furthermore, all homeless households are subject to a universal screening assessment by the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust. Homeless households referred to the Owner/Agent will be those households deemed best served for rapid placement into rental housing with minimal need for support.
- The Owner/Agent will apply this admissions preference as follows:
  - 1. The set-aside units listed above will be dedicated to the homeless preference. The units will be available upon vacancy and held for a maximum of one week (7 calendar days).
  - 2. Only the units listed above will be filled by the preference.

#### **Additional Rental Assistance**

PHCD Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program will also provide a preference to elderly families who qualify as homeless.

- 3. Household matches the property's income, household size etc.

## III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF OWNER/AGENT

- Provide the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust, as attachments to this MOU or in separate email, with the following documents:
  - 1. Standard Application
  - 2. Standard Lease Agreement including specifications regarding utility payments
  - 3. Property's screening criteria
  - 4. List of documents needed for a complete application
  - 5. Property rules related to smoking, parking, pets, etc.
- Email the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust point of contact with timely notification of a vacancy that will be assigned to the homeless preference and provide relevant information about the vacant unit.
- Copy the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust on all communication with a homeless applicant. Note that the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust will obtain a Release of Information for each household to allow this communication to proceed.
- Whenever possible, accept initial applications by secure email or fax in order to decrease the number of visits the applicant and service provider need to make to the property.
- Screen the batch of up to three referred applicants for eligibility and suitability in the order received from the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust (i.e. Applicant #1 and Applicant #2).
- Alert the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust and applicants of any deficiencies in applications.
- Make an eligibility determination within 2 business days whenever possible.
  - 1. If an applicant is denied housing, consider mitigating documentation that may be supplied by the applicant during the appeal process.
- Respond to brief quarterly emails from the Miami HUD Field Office asking for updates on move-ins, move-outs under the homeless preference.

Paragraph 1 of the HUD HEARTH Act definition of homeless:

1) An individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, meaning:

(i) An individual or family with a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport, or camping ground; or

(ii) An individual or family living in a supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, State, or local government programs for low-income individuals); or

(iii) An individual who is exiting an institution where he or she resided for 90 days or less and who resided in an emergency shelter or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution;

This preference will include the following:

1. It will be effective <u>4/15/16</u> and/or when approved by HUD.

2. The current waiting list for each property will be maintained consistent with HUD 4350.3 guidelines and the property's Affirmative Fair Housing Market Plan (AFHMP).

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5. Referrals for available units will be accepted from the Miami-Dade Homeless Trust referral agency (owner/management choice), pursuant to paragraph V (d) of HUD Notice 2013-21. All applicants must comply with current admissions requirements at the specific property, including income, age, and criminal/credit screening. # Ley de aborto en Texas desata divergencias

piden a la Corte Suprema que devuelva a los estados la autoridad de regular el aborto, al no estar reglamentado en la Constitución de la nación

"Devolver a los estados la autoridad plena para regular el aborto, sin interferencia federal, restablecería las relaciones adecuadas entre los estados y el gobierno federal", argumentó el gobernador de Florida, Ron DeSantis.

Florida y los 10 estados se refieren al fallo Roe vs Wade, que fue emitido por la Corte Suprema en 1973, precisamente en contra del estado de Texas que prohibía el aborto.

Entonces, el máximo tribunal de justicia de la nación sostuvo que el derecho de la mujer al aborto estaba implícito en el derecho a la privacidad, protegido por la Enmienda 14 de la Constitución.

Así, sin más cuestiona-miento, se legalizó el aborto en todo el país, pero comenzó el choque de ideas y precepciones filosóficas religiosas entre antiabortistas y promotores de los derechos de la mujer.

El presidente de Esta-dos Unidos, Joe Biden, declaró: "Esta ley (de Texas) es tan extrema que ni siquiera permite excepciones en el caso de violación o incesto" y anticipó que si la Corte Suprema no acepta corregirla podria provocar "un caos incons-titucional", ante la existen-cia del fallo Roe vs. Wade, que ha sido la ley del país durante casi 50 años"

Una nueva lev que restringe el aborto entró en vigor en el estado de Texas, después de que la Corte Suprema de Estados Unidos optó por no pronunciarse, ante una soli-citud de emergencia que la habria frenado, por no

considerarlo necesario. La norma, conocida como Ley del Latido del Corazón de Texas, prohibe básicamente el aborto después de que el sonido del latido sea detectado en un ultrasonido, lo cual suele darse alrededor de la sexta semana de embarazo, aun cuando muchas mujeres no saben que están embarazadas, sin excepciones por violación o incesto.

De esta manera, Texas espera disminuir drásticamente los más de 55.000 abortos que se realizan al año.

Se disminuirá "aproximadamente entre 85 y 90%", ya que, según la aso-ciación Unión Estadounidense de Libertades Civiles (ACLU), quienes abortan en Texas tienen al menos seis semanas de embarazo.

De hecho, la ley fue adoptada por el Con-greso estatal de Texas y el gobernador republicano Greg Abbott la ratificó el pasado mes de junio. "Es una ley favorable

que convertirá a Texas en uno de los primeros estados en poner fin a los abortos", señaló enton-ces en Twitter el autor del proyecto de ley, el representante estatal Giovanni Capriglione.

La ley adoptada plantea que los médicos podrían

enfrentar cadena perpetua o multas de 100.000 dólares si realizan abortos prohibidos.

Además, bonifica con 10.000 dólares a quienes denuncien el acto y sus ayudantes, aún si el infor-mante no reside en Texas. Pero un grupo de opo-

sitores y proveedores de aborto apelaron a la Corte Suprema de la nación, para estudiar el caso antes de que la ley entrara en vigor el 1 de septiembre.

No obstante, el máximo organismo iudicial del país, visiblemente dividido, votó 5 a 4 para denegar la apelación de emergencia. Pero los juesobre si la ley puede mantenerse porque aún se pueden presentar otras impugnaciones.

#### Otros estados

Acorde con el informe del Instituto Guttmacher, una organización sin ánimo de lucro que apoya el derecho al aborto, con sedes en Nueva York y Washington DC, más de 850.000 abortos tienen lugar en Estados Unidos cada año.

De hecho, en 1996, cuando las medidas preventivas médicas eran menores, la

cifra superó 1.3 millones. Si bien ya se han aprobado prohibiciones similares a la de Texas en una docena de estados, hasta ahora todas habían sido bloqueadas en los tribunales.

Entre esas leyes resalta la norma aprobada por Mississippi en 2018, que prohibe realizar un aborto después de las 15 semanas de embarazo, y cuya demanda será atendida por los jueces del Supremo en octubre.

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# Florida starts turning on DeSantis

It's new terrain for a Republican governor who defied dire expectation during the first wave of Covid-19 but has continued his hands-off approach as the more contagious Delta variant infects large swaths of Florida's unvaccinated population.

The most recent defeat came Friday when Leon County Circuit Court Judge John Cooper ruled DeSantis can't punish school districts for passing mask mandates, as his administration had threatened after instituting emergency rules aimed at banning mask mandates in schools. The DeSantis administration has said those districts are breaking the law, an assertion directly refuted in a blistering ruling from Cooper read from the bench during a nearly two hour hearing.

The multi-front Covid-19 battle is becoming inextricably linked to DeSantis' 2022 re-election bid, and more broadly his future White House aspirations. The governor remains popular with conservatives across the country and in Florida, but his steadfast refusal to implement Covid-related restrictions amid hundreds of virus-related deaths in the state and rising infection numbers has the potential to threaten his electability.

"There's no question it's impacting him politically," said a Republican consultant who has previously worked with DeSantis and requested anonymity to speak freely. "You can tout all the freedom and anti-lockdown that you want. There's no political strategy for sick kids and tired parents."

A Quinnipiac University poll released this month had DeSantis' approval rating dipping below 50 percent, with 47 percent approving of his job performance, and 45 percent disapproving. Those numbers dropped to 44-51 when asked about his handling of public schools. The Quinnipiac poll follows other public polling that shows a similar erosion to DeSantis' approval rating. A St. Pete Polls survey earlier this month showed 43 percent approved of the job he was doing while 48 percent did not.

The poll also brought bad news for President Joe Biden, who is the frequent target of criticism from DeSantis. Biden's approval rating sits at 40 percent in Florida, while 53 percent disapprove of his

job performance. The poll was conducted between Aug. 17 and 21, a time when Biden was facing heavy criticism over his withdrawal from Afghanistan, an issue that has kept the national news cycle from focusing on DeSantis and Florida's Covid-19 situation.

Yet DeSantis has focused in recent weeks on traversing the state to tout new sites that deliver the monoclonal antibody treatment. The treatment can reduce the likelihood that a Covid-19 patient lands in the hospital if it is given shortly after infection. But it is far less effective than vaccines at preventing severe illness and death. The state has so far opened up 21 of the sites and the conservative media outlet One America News Network will air a 2-day series on the treatments with the title "America's Governor & Florida's Grit: How Antibody Therapy Combats COVID-19."

"We think the thing that has the most impact to keep people out of the hospital and save lives is to really make sure this early treatment is something people have access to," DeSantis told reporters Thursday. "Even with a massive number of people vaccinated, you still have prevalence."

"It's going to be part of life," DeSantis added.

His fight with schools over masking children, however has also escalated. Already, 10 school districts have bucked the governor over his order banning schools from implementing mask mandates, including Sarasota County and Indian River County school districts, which are in conservative-leaning regions of the state.

But Cooper, the judge who ruled against DeSantis Friday, opened the door for more local defiance. Cooper not only ruled against the administration, but said that previous legislation DeSantis-championed known as the "Parents Bill of Rights" actually allows districts to craft



their own mask policies.

"A school district, adopting a policy, such as a mask mandate, is acting within its discretion it has been given by the Florida Legislature in the Parents Bill of Rights," Cooper said. "The doctrine of separation of powers requires that the discretionary power exercised by the school board, cannot be interfered by the judiciary, or by the executive branch of government."

DeSantis communications director Taryn Fenske said they would appeal.

"It's not surprising that Judge Cooper would rule against parent's rights and their ability to make the best educational and medical decisions for their family, but instead rule in favor of elected politicians," she said. "This ruling was made with incoherent justifications, not based on science and facts."

Infection rates for kids under 12, who are not yet eligible for the vaccine, last week increased to 23 percent, up from an average of 15 percent since March 1. Nearly 17,000 Covid-19 patients are in hospitals, far above the 2020 peak. And Florida's nearly 1,500 deaths reported last week was by far the biggest single seven-day increase since the state started reporting Covid-19 data.

DeSantis' losses over Covid-19 policy have not been confined to land.

Disney, one of Florida's largest Republican donors, this week joined Carnival, Norwegian and Royal Caribbean in requiring vaccines for passengers older than 12. The wave of cruise operators requiring vaccines was, in part, prompted by vaccination requirements for cruise passengers put in place by the government of the Bahamas, which is the first stop for most major cruise ships. It's a di

rect violation of DeSantis-pressed legislation that bars vaccine passports as well as guidance from the federal government over cruise ship safety.

Earlier this month, a federal judge in Miami blocked Florida from enforcing the law against Norwegian Cruise Line Holdings, a ruling that gave cover for other industry operators — like Disney — to go against DeSantis' wishes on vaccine passports. Attorneys for DeSantis plan to appeal the decision.

DeSantis has continued to use the pandemic to help what has been a well-oiled political fundraising machine. Most recently, the governor's political committee sent a fundraising email based on a feud he had with the Associated Press, which published a story implying De-Santis was boosting monoclonal antibody treatments to help a political donor.

That story was met with a blistering response from DeSantis press secretary Christina Pushaw, whose attack on the reporter who wrote the story landed her a 12 hour Twitter suspension and prompted the wire service to send a letter to DeSantis asking his office to stop "bullying" reporters.

The governor's political rivals are also keying in on the pandemic, with Rep. Charlie Crist and Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried, DeSantis' top 2022 Democratic rivals, turning their focus to the administration's response.

"Governor DeSantis has made it clear that he wants to put politics over keeping schools open and keeping our economy strong," Crist's campaign said in an email. "But today's ruling makes clear that he's overstepped his authority."

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## **Performance Scoring Policy**

Applications for New and Renewal Projects will undergo a threshold review to ensure compliance with the HEARTH Act, the Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) and the local CoC Request for Applications. Any new or renewal project not meeting the threshold requirement will not be further reviewed and will not be considered for funding. Renewal projects have previously passed Housing and Urban Development (HUD) threshold review and only in very exceptional cases of changed HUD policies or program changes will be at risk of not passing the threshold review.

The Homeless Trust makes available and accepts comment on the scoring standards for renewal projects on our website, and annually at CoC Planning meetings. The HUD CoC Project Rating and Ranking Tool, with feedback incorporated through the CoC Subcommittee, is included in the local NOFA solicitation.

Scoring of Renewal Projects is tabulated by Homeless Trust staff using the HUD CoC Project Rating and Ranking Tool amended with feedback from the CoC Subcommittee; the tool is largely based on prior year performance on HUD-approved System Performance Measures, project costs, project alignment with Housing First and the applicant's ability to spend the previous year's award.

The Miami-Dade County Mayor appoints a selection committee of subject matter experts to review, rate and rank New Project applications, including Reallocation, Expansion and Bonus Project applications. After meeting the local RFA and program requirements, all New Projects are subject to the scoring outlined in the local RFA and new project scoring criteria, Attachment 20. The Selection Committee utilizes scoring to inform the selection of conditional sub-recipients. The committee has the discretion to select one or more applications for the amount available for New Projects. The committee also may give staff direction to negotiate with conditional applicants.

New and Renewal Projects will receive additional points based on the HUD Housing First Assessment Tool. Renewal Projects receive additional points based on the percentage of funds drawn in the previous year.

## **Ranking Policy**

HUD requires Collaborative Applicants to rank all projects in two tiers. Tier 1 is defined by HUD in the NOFA as a percent of the CoC's Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) approved by HUD on the final HUDapproved Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW). Tier 1 projects are traditionally protected from HUD cuts. Tier 2 is the difference between Tier 1 and the CoC's ARD plus any amount available for bonus (including the Domestic Violence Bonus) as described in the HUD NOFA. Tier 2 projects must compete nationally for funding.

Renewal projects will be scored and ranked according to the HUD CoC Project Rating and Ranking Tool amended with feedback provided by the CoC Subcommittee, alignment with Housing First and prior year spending of grant funds, except for Coordinated Entry projects, First Time Renewals including Expansion projects, Change of Project Sponsor or Consolidated projects funded as part of the NOFA competition that have not been in operation for at least one year. These projects will be placed at the bottom of Tier 1 ahead of any Renewal Projects who ranked in Tier 2 and New Projects unless otherwise instructed in the USHUD CoC NOFA.

Projects that are deemed essential to the CoC but which would be at risk of losing funding if placed in Tier 2, will be ranked at the bottom of Tier 1. This includes: Joint component Transitional Housing with Rapid Re-Housing (joint TH and PH:RRH) targeting homeless youth and Support Services Only-Street Outreach projects providing Coordinated Entry.

Tier 2: Project components will be organized to best maximize the CoC Consolidated Application Overall Score.

Projects will be ranked as follows:

- Renewal Project applications ranked according to HUD CoC Project Rating and Ranking Tool (Tier 1 and 2)
- Support Services Only-Street Outreach projects providing Coordinated Entry (Tier 1)
- New Joint Component Transitional Housing with Rapid Rehousing dedicated to unaccompanied or parenting youth (Tier 1)
- Projects funded as part of the NOFA competition that have not been in operation for at least one year including Expansion, Change of Project Sponsor and Consolidation Projects (Tier 1)
- First Time Renewal Projects (Tier 1)
- New reallocation, Expansion and Bonus Project applications ranked according to New Project scores that emphasize the HUD priorities outlined in the NOFA (Tier 2)

The Planning Project is not ranked.

## **Re-Allocation Policy**

Any funds reallocated as part of recapturing unspent funds, voluntary or involuntary reallocation will be made available for reallocation to create new projects during the local solicitation process.

## **Unspent Funds**

Projects that are not fully expending or underspending their grant awards are subject to the reallocation process. Projects that have underspent their award by 10% may be reduced and those funds will go to reallocation for New Project(s). A one-year grace period may be extended by the Homeless Trust to providers who appeal proposed reallocation with a plan that demonstrates that the grant's expenditure will be improved in the current program year. Projects that have under-expended more than 10% of their award in two consecutive program years, without reallocation during the previous year, will have their funding reduced through reallocation in the CoC NOFA competition. The Homeless Trust will recapture 80% of unspent funds after making allowances for vacancies.

## Voluntary Re-Allocation

As part of the local solicitation for inclusion in the HUD CoC collaborative application, providers are strongly encouraged to reallocate projects that are not spending their full award, underutilizing beds, underperforming and/or not in alignment with Housing First principles and practices. Such reallocated funds are pooled for reallocation to New Projects. The competitive process for New Projects provides bonus points as an incentive to providers offering to reallocate their entire project funds to create a New Project addressing CoC priorities.

## Involuntary Re-Allocation (Unconditional v Conditional Renewal)

Projects with poor performance, not spending their full award, underutilizing beds, not in alignment with Housing First principles and practices, not serving the intended population or with significant, unresolved findings are subject to involuntary reallocation.

The Homeless Trust has established a threshold for unconditional renewal. Projects who score below 50 points of the weighted ranking score will be placed on corrective action and may be ranked in Tier 2. All projects submitting full renewal applications meeting threshold and scored above the threshold are approved for renewal without conditions.

Projects scoring below the threshold will be asked to develop a plan to address performance issues by next year's competition (Performance Improvement Plan), or to voluntarily give up award money to be reallocated to a New Project. If problems continue, projects may be reallocated in the following cycle. Applicants may appeal the decision and the appeal must be considered by the Homeless Trust Board.

Determination of any conditions to renewal will be made at least 45 days ahead of the NOFA due date. Any required Performance Improvement Plans or plan that demonstrates that the grant's expenditure will be improved as part of a reallocation appeal must be submitted for approval at least 30 days ahead of the NOFA due date, so that a final determination can be made as to whether the project goes forward for renewal. A final list of Renewal Projects will be presented to the CoC Board and posted on the Homeless Trust website.

WHEREAS, U.S. HUD will award up to 10 bonus points to CoCs that submit new permanent supportive housing project applications demonstrating coordination with housing providers and healthcare organizations; and

WHEREAS, the bonus points require CoCs to apply for at least one new permanent supportive housing project that utilizes housing subsidies or subsidized housing units not funded through the CoC or ESG programs; and

WHEREAS, the bonus points require CoCs to apply for at least one new permanent supportive housing project that utilizes healthcare resources to help individuals and families experiencing homelessness, including direct contributions from a public or private health insurance provider to the project, and provision of health care services by a private or public organization tailored to the program participants of the project; and

WHEREAS, the HACMB is reserving a set-aside of twenty-five (25) tenant-based HCVs to support the creation of additional permanent supportive housing for individuals and families experiencing homelessness, based on voucher availability, and contingent upon an award of funding by U.S. HUD to MDHT for the healthcare resources to support this initiative; and

WHEREAS, the 25 vouchers will be subject to a preference for families experiencing homelessness in accordance with the Miami-Dade Continuum of Care's (CoC) Orders of Priority and referred through the MDHT Coordinated Entry process; and

WHEREAS, the families experiencing homelessness to be served under this set-aside must currently reside within the City of Miami Beach, or if residing outside of the City of Miami Beach, have had contact with the City of Miami Beach, as evidenced by records in the CoC Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), a local information technology system used to collect client-level data on the provision of housing and services to homeless individuals and families; and

WHEREAS, this partnership between the HACMB and MDHT enables the CoC to submit a competitive application for funding, and serves as an innovative strategy to end homelessness in Miami-Dade County, and specifically within the City of Miami Beach.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA that the HACMB Board of Commissioners hereby reserve a set-aside of twenty-five (25) tenant-based HCVs to support the creation of additional permanent supportive housing for individuals and families experiencing homelessness, based on voucher availability, and contingent upon an award of funding by U.S. HUD to MDHT for the healthcare resources to support this initiative.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner Khaghan who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Greeff and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
